BYLAW NO. 149/2020

A BYLAW TO RECOVER PROTECTIVE SERVICES COSTS

The Council of the Resort Village of Chitek Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw:
 - a) "Administrator" shall mean the administrator of the municipality;
 - b) "Council" shall mean the council of the municipality; and
 - c) "Municipality" shall mean the Resort Village of Chitek Lake.

2. The cost of fire prevention, suppression and emergency response services shall be charged directly on the persons who receive it in accordance with *The Municipalities Act*.
 - Schedule "A" which is attached to and forming a part of this bylaw.
 - The rates contained within the Fire Rates Bylaw which may be revised from time to time.
 - The Council may authorize the Administrator to add to the taxes of any property owned by the person references in Section 2 of this bylaw any amount which remains unpaid 30 days after the person has been invoiced for said services.
 - Fire Chief reserves the right to instruct Administrator; of the Resort Village of Chitek Lake, to send a letter stating the false alarm has been used for the calendar year and to have an invoice generated for the abuse of false alarms by security companies.
 - Vehicles/Automobiles- (any vehicle listed in *The Automobile Accident Insurance Act, The All Terrain Vehicles Act, The Traffic Safety Act, The Snowmobile Act, and The Highways and Transportation Act*-) Fire suppression services will be charged to the vehicle/property owner or their insurer(s) and for all vehicle accidents, vehicle fires, and fires caused by a vehicle fire occurring within the boundaries of the Resort Village of Chitek Lake or when called within the Rural Municipality No.496 and all other areas which the Fire Department responds to.

3. Repeal Bylaw No. 147/2019.

All calls for 911 are received via cell phone by the fire crew. All responding fire fighters will be invoiced at the minimum call out fee to the land owner.

False alarms will be invoiced the minimum call out fee to the land owner for each fire fighter that responds.

One FREE false alarm per calendar year.

Any other services from neighbouring communities or businesses for assisting with be invoiced at cost.

Example: fire equipment, fire fighters, water trucks, etc.
